#### Dear Lake Hood Families,

Safety is our number one priority here at Lake . Hood.

Therefore, we plan and drill monthly so we are prepared to respond effectively during a crisis. We have procedures to lock the school down and to evacuate if necessary, as well as "Duck, Cover, and Hold" during an earthquake. Staff; are trained to cover all of our emergency procedures, and they are visibly posted in each classroom. If you would like further information regarding our safety procedures then please came visit our school. We would be happy to answer any questions. Lastly, we have a safety reminder. If you choose lane 1 while picking up your child, please **DO NOT** get out of your vehicle. This causes the line to back up and creates safety issues. There is always the option to park in lanes 2 and 3 and walk over to escort your child to your vehicle. Also, please always use 1 of the 3 cross walks located in lane 1. We also have traffic flow maps for pick up and drop off in the office for your convenience.

Safety is our number one concern, and only with your help can we assure that this priority is maintained.



### Buddy Bears Wanted: Preschool

The district strives to provide opportunities for our preschool students with disabilities to interact and be educated with typically developing peers. The Buddy Bear program allows an opportunity for each preschool special education classroom to include typically developing same age peers. The current model is not intended to provide early childhood education for the Buddy Bear. It is designed to support the development of young children who are identified as developmentally disabled.

There are a limited amount of Buddy Bear spots per preschool session. Program needs will be determined by the administrative and school based teams and will be reviewed throughout the school year. The number of Buddy Bear students is based on the enrollment and needs of the special education students in each class. Those interested must complete a Buddy Bear application. All new Buddy Bear applicants must be screened. Buddy Bears are selected on a first come, first serve basis. If you know of a student 3-5 years of age and would like more information on this program please contact the preschool team at 245-5521 or stop by for an application.
